Steps for Each Drawing Lesson

These guidelines are taken from page 114 of Drawing with Children. Use them to guide each of the drawing lessons.

Warm-up

- Do Body and Eye Relaxations.
- Review the Five elements of contour shape.
- Choose and complete a Warm-up exercise.

Planning

- Arrange your sample materials
- Choose the paper and supplies
- Imagine your main subject in the drawing.
- Imagine the whole composition.
- Project them on the blank piece of paper.
- Make preliminary sketches of your ideas.

Beginning

- Choose the central point to start with.
- Project that starting point onto the blank paper.
- Observe the elements and duplicate them.
- Go to the adjacent part next.
- Observe those elements and duplicate them.
- Draw the general shape of the object first.
- Draw the objects first then add backgrounds.

Finishing Touches

- Add the details of the objects.
- Add color, shading, and textures.
- Add background ideas.

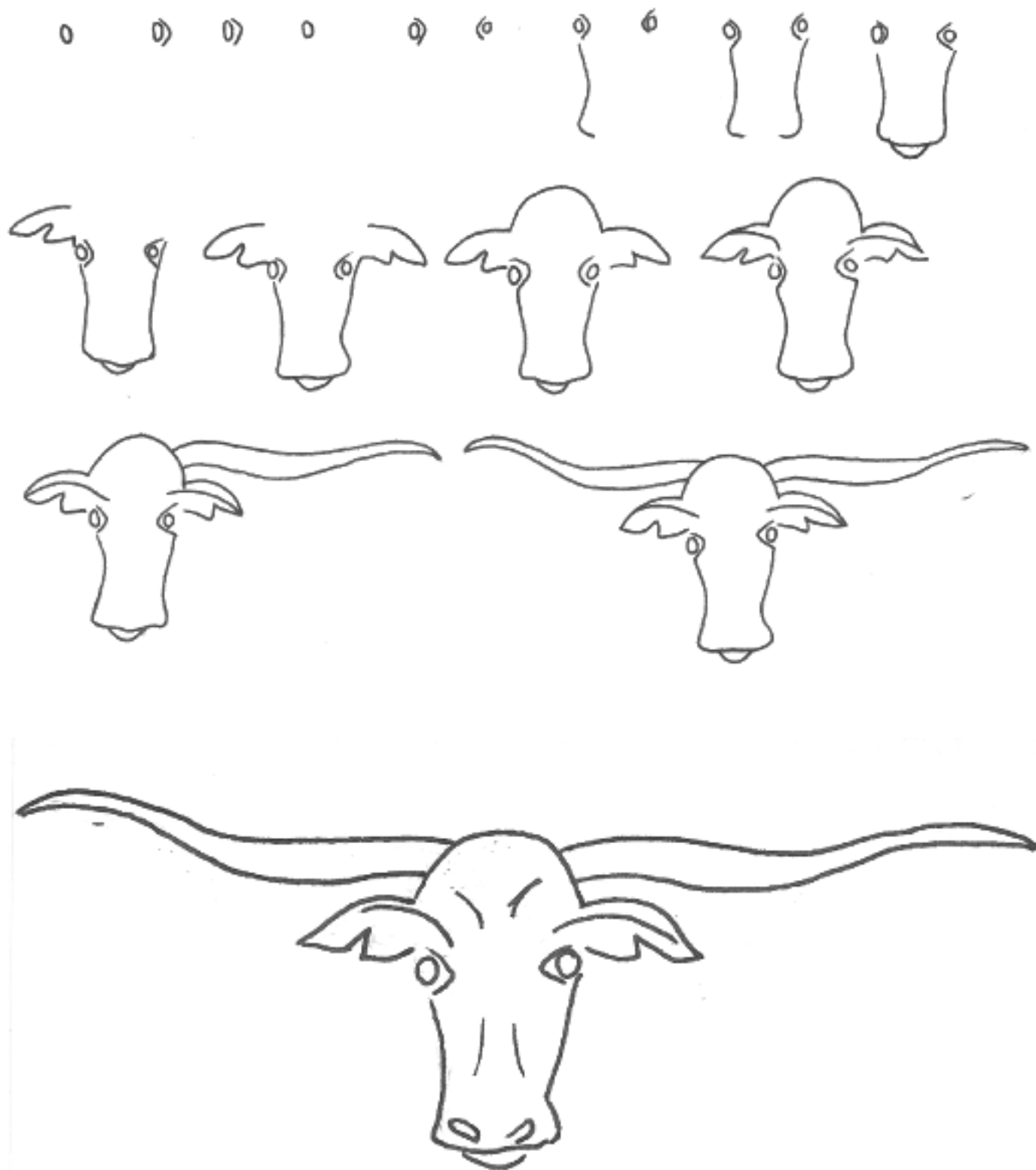


Duplication Warm-up Sheets
