<p>Comprehension Questions: What is a historian? <i>A person who studies people or events that occurred in the past, collects that information and writes it down in books.</i> What is an archeologist? <i>Archeologist excavate (carefully dig up) the land surrounding a place where people in an ancient civilization might have lived.</i> What is the first story that is told in the Bible? <i>The story of creation.</i> How many days did it take God to create the world? <i>It took six days for God to create the world.</i> What did God do on the seventh day? <i>He rested.</i> FYI: One reliable source of information about ancient history is the Bible. The Bible not only gives us information about past civilizations, but more importantly it provides us with God's Word where He tells us His-story (Jesus' story) throughout the Old and New Testaments. In Genesis, Jesus is depicted as the creator of the world. The stories in the Old Testament point to the coming Messiah. The Gospels in the New Testament tells of Jesus' ministry, birth, death, and resurrection, and the rest of the New Testament points to a time when Jesus will come back at the end of time.</p> <p>History Pockets: Take time this week to assemble the pocket book. Then let your child work on the first portion of the book. We have found younger kids are more eager to sit still during the read aloud time if they have history pockets to work on. Coloring and cutting seems to keep their hands busy, so they listen better to the story being read.</p>
